Oct. 26 deadline for Governor's Innovators in Business Awards nominations

West Palm Beach, FL – Your company may be eligible to compete for a Governor's Innovators in Business Awards. The award recognizes businesses for making noteworthy contributions toward Florida's economic development efforts.

Three awards will be given in each of these categories:

Governor's Business Expansion Award:

For Florida companies that expanded their operations in 2011, investing capital and creating jobs for Floridians.

Governor's Newcomer Award: For new-to-Florida companies that began business operations in 2011.

Governor's Export Excellence Award: For Florida companies with new or significant increases in documented export sales in 2011.

Governor's Entrepreneurship Award:

For Florida start-up companies (less than five years old) that have set a standard for entrepreneurship and creativity.

Awards will be given in each of the following market categories:

- · Mid Market: County population up to 150,000
- · Major Market: County population 150,001 to 800,000
- \cdot Mega Market: County population 800,001 and higher

The winners will be acknowledged during Florida's Industry Appreciation Week, the dates of which soon will be announced.

All nominations will be considered. Self-nominations are acceptable as well as nominations by local economic development organizations. The entry deadline is Friday, Oct. 26 at 5 p.m. ET., and the nomination application is available on Enterprise Florida's Web site, <u>www.eflorida.com/govawards</u>
